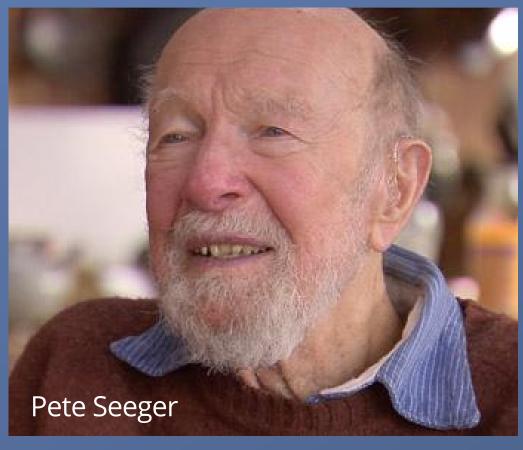


Singing is a powerful tool for human connection and social change.

THE FILM WE BEGAN TO SING is a 24-minute documentary at the intersection of singing and social change. It follows Annie Patterson and Peter Blood, musician-activists who believe in communal singing as a form of social capital, a way to generate connection, cooperation and community. As they learned from their longtime friend Pete Seeger, singing together offers a potent antidote to polarization and isolation.

WHY THIS FILM Lived experiences from the Civil Rights era to the present reveal how singing together animates movements for social justice and change. The film offers an ethos of constructive activism, acknowledging that while the struggle for change is ongoing, we only succeed by working together.





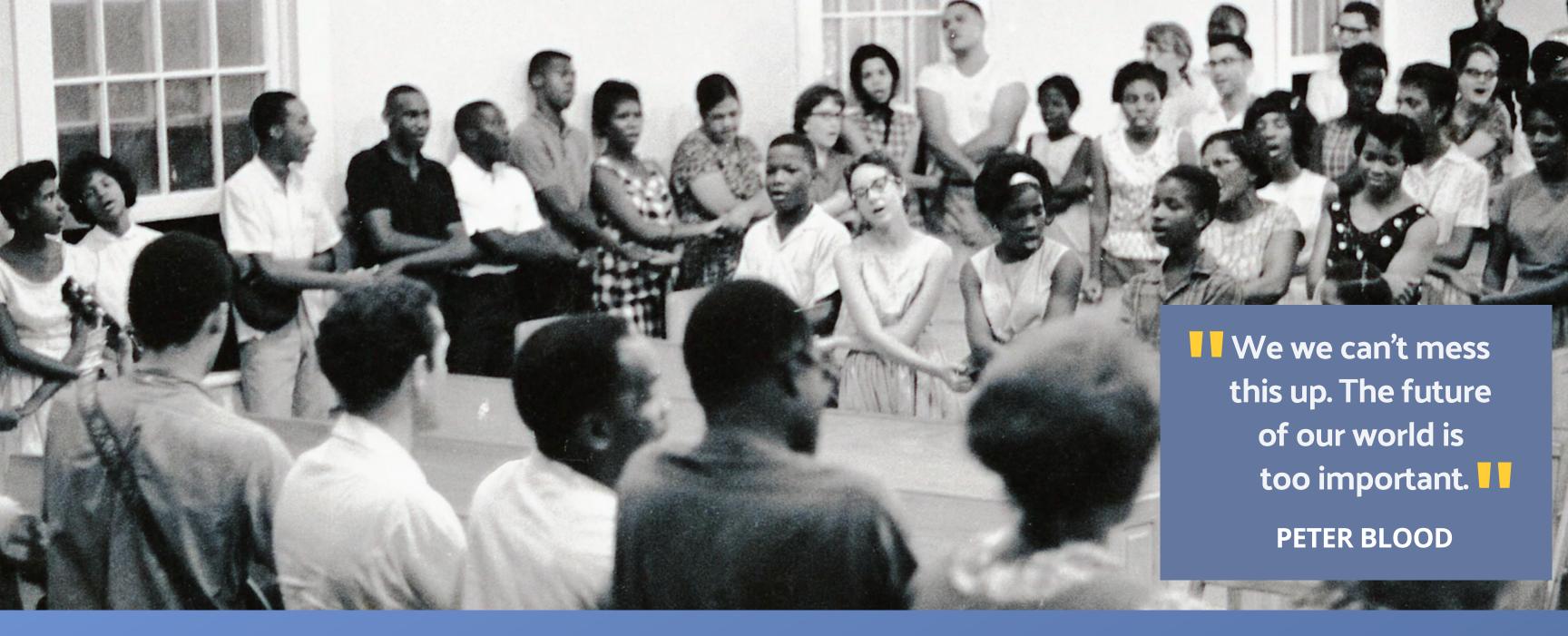
