#### **DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT**

As a young woman I found myself on a Pennsylvania farm with a family who sang spontaneously around the dinner table. My own family never sang together, and the sound of these voices stirred something deep within me, a longing to sing with others, freely, informally, without judgment.

And why not? This is how people sang for most of human history. In many cultures they still do. I wondered why, in North America, most of us had lost that enveloping routine, that marvelous habit of singing together. After more than a century of recorded music, millions of us have become mere consumers of other people singing. Perhaps we've persuaded ourselves that we can't sing.

The current revival of communal singing is giving the lie to that notion, aided by the efforts of Pete Seeger, Annie Patterson, Peter Blood, and many others. When we sing with other people, we feel a palpable sense of belonging. Our spirits are nourished, our hearts are lightened. Singing seems to satisfy an itch that springs from deep inside our soul. Making this film convinced me that we are all wired to sing. All of us are singers.

## **ABOUT THE FILM**

Singing as a tool for social change is the focus of *We Began To Sing*. The film follows two New England activists as they lead community singing events in the US and Canada and share stories and songs about peace, immigration, and racial justice. Their lives are committed to the revival of communal singing, what their friend and mentor Pete Seeger called the 'people's music.' Today, as deep cultural fissures threaten our social compact, their work takes on new urgency. The film features Patterson, Peter Blood, and the late folksinger.

#### **FILM SUBJECTS**

#### **Annie Patterson & Peter Blood**

Peter and Annie each grew up in families that sang together. When they met, they began to realize how rare and wonderful that experience was and how much it had informed their lives. Together they were inspired to create song books that would help revive the lost tradition of informal group singing. The success of *Rise Up Singing* and *Rise Again* changed the face of community singing in North America. The couple has led hundreds of group singing events and workshops throughout the world.

**Annie,** performs as a song leader, vocalist extraordinaire, a folk and jazz musician, and multi-instrumentalist. She also sings with two swing bands, Girls from Mars and The O-Tones. **Peter** sang and learned to play the guitar in his teens, continuing to do so as an activist for civil rights, nonviolent direct action, and in ongoing efforts to end the war in Vietnam. He edited Pete Seeger's autobiography, *Where Have All the Flowers Gone: A Singalong Memoir*.

## **Pete Seeger**

Pete was the iconic folk singer of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. For seven decades he inspired people from all walks of life to sing with each other. As a tireless activist, Pete had an impact on the major social change movements of his era. A prolific songwriter, he recorded more than 40 albums and influenced generations of fellow musicians. Millions of people were personally touched by his life, his integrity, and his music, including Annie and Peter with whom he collaborated on *Rise Up Singing* and *Rise Again*. Pete died in 2014 at age 94.
